

Pordenone, Reghena Park

The Via Reghena park is located near the city centre and is touched by the river Noncello. Because of its characteristic proximity to the river this green area is called "river naturalistic".

The park can be divided into two main areas: an upper part, conforming in appearance and type to that of a real modern public garden, and a lower, more wild part, where the conditions are more similar to the spaces closed to a water course.

In the lower part there is a natural and spontaneous arboreal and shrub vegetation. It is located in an area of depression of the land, bounded on the north by the railway line and on the south by the residential area of via Reghena.

This peculiarity means that the area is subjected to a constant and abundant water presence and, as already happened in the first ten days of November 2010, it could undergo a submersion following the flooding of the nearby Noncello.

In the upper part, however, there are defined paths and well-marked and well-kept flowerbeds.

The space in this area has been structured to allow both relaxation and entertainment for visitors, young and old. Here it is possible to walk through the maze of hornbeams and admire specimens of country maple, English oak, ash, maple, lime and alder.

There are two play areas dedicated to children: one for children aged 3 to 8 and the other for children aged 8 to 15 years. In addition, for adults who want to keep fit, there are several fitness stations and paths to train with running or walking surrounded by nature.
